



NATIONAL MUESUM, NEW DELHI



DUDHSAGAR WATERFALLS

GOA

This waterfall comes under the top 10 places to visit in Goa. Located in Mollem National Park Dudhsagar is one of the tallest waterfalls in India. Tourists are often attracted to this 310 m high waterfall, which divides across four tiers on the Mandovi river, resembling a rush of milk falling down the hill. Monsoon season offers a full view of the fall and the surrounding deciduous forests.

Yet the best time to visit is during October to May, as the jeep safari stops operating during the monsoon season. During

monsoons the waterfall swells up due to the heavy rainfall and the pool deepens making it unsafe to swim in. Goa can be reached conveniently from any part of the country and is well connected by air, rail and road network.

Interesting Facts About Dudhsagar waterfalls

- ✪ Dudhsagar waterfalls is among the top five highest waterfalls in India and top 100 waterfalls in the world.
- ✪ The waterfall has a height of 300 meters and a width of 30 meters.
- ✪ A scene from the blockbuster movie 'Chennai Express' was shot here since then raising the popularity of the falls as a major tourist attraction.

BRIHADESHWARA Temple

THANJAVUR, Tamil Nadu

★ UNESCO World HERITAGE SITE

Thanjavur's Brihadeshwara Temple, dedicated to Lord Shiva, is one of the most ancient temples in Tamil nadu

History	Brihadeshwara Temple was built by King Rajaraja Chola I, in the 11th century, to celebrate a military victory. Thanjavur or Tanjore was made by the Cholas from a collection of villages into a major temple center around 1000 years ago. Brihadeshwar Temple was first constructed and then the city was built around it. This temple is the best example of excellent workmanship, which attracts thousands of visitors every year. The complex that houses the main sanctum is known as the Periya Kovil.
Architecture	The temple is built over 29 square bases and surrounded by a moat on two sides and Anaicut River on the other side. The walls of the complex are adorned by beautiful paintings belonging to the Chola and Nayak period. The Siva Lingam here is gigantic, more than 12 feet tall. The Nandi, facing the sanctum, is also 12 feet in height and the dwarapalas and deities around the main shrine look elegant.
Construction technique	After dusk, when the temple is illuminated, its top most light over the dome seems not less than another planet glowing and coming closer to the earth. There are two idols of Ganesha at the entrance of sanctum. It generates sound travelling through stone in one idol and through metal on the other while tapping.

GEMS AND JEWELLERY

PAINTING



Rajasthan is famous for its jewellery industry and it is one of the world's largest centres for hand-cutting of gems. It is India's important source for precious and semi-precious stones like, Ruby, Emerald, Garnets, Agate, Amethyst, Topaz, Lapis lazuli, Carnelian, etc.

Rajasthan is also known for the art of silver smithy, beginning from anklets to earrings to head gears. A lot of effort goes into their making, since most of the rural communities wear silver ornaments. Besides silver, it is known for its Lac bangles, Kundan and Minakari, enamelled gold jewellery, uncut diamonds and emerald-cutting. Another most exclusive art is 'thewa' from Chittaur is popular for its gold work on glass. Some traditional adornments are Rakhdi (head ornament), Tussi (necklace), Baju Bandh (armlet), Adah (special necklace worn by Rajputs), Gokhrus (bracelets), Pajeb (anklets), etc.



As Rajasthan is the historical hub for the Rajput rulers, it has emerged as a pioneer for miniature paintings in India. Rajasthani painters portrayed the royal and romantic life of Mughal rulers in these paintings. Other paintings include the lifestyle of Rajasthan connected with the incidents from Ramayana or Mahabharata.

Alaknanda & Bhagirathi Rivers

Devprayag in Uttarakhand

Alaknanda and Bhagirathi rivers meet at Devprayag in Uttarakhand, India, forming the Ganges River (Ganga). Devprayag is a town in Tehri Garhwal district, 70 km from Rishikesh, and has an average elevation of 830 meters (2,723 feet). Devprayag is the final confluence of the Alaknanda River, which originates at the confluence of the Satopanth and Bhagirath Kharak glaciers, and the Bhagirathi River, which originates at Gaumukh, at the foot of the Gangotri and Khatling glaciers. The Alaknanda is considered the source stream of the Ganges in hydrology, while in Hindu tradition and culture, the Bhagirathi is considered the source stream. Devprayag is a popular pilgrimage destination, and is believed to be the place where Lord Rama and his father King Dasharath performed penance. Other attractions in Devprayag include Devprayag Sangam, Raghunathji Temple, and the Chandrabadani Devi.



India's first UNDERWATER METRO LINE KOLKATA

India's first underwater metro line, 'The Howrah Maidan' to Esplanade metro, was opened in March 2024 in Kolkata, connecting the sister cities through a 520-meter tunnel under the Hooghly River. The 10.8 km of the corridor is underground including the tunnel, which is managed by Metro Railway, Kolkata, and Kolkata Metro Rail Corporation. The line is a part of the Green Line and includes the Howrah Metro station which is the deepest metro station in the country.

As the train enters the under-river stretch, a glimpse of the illumination of the tunnel wall under the Hooghly River greets the commuters, giving the effects of water around the moving rake.

The under-river section of the tunnel is 520 meters long, and the train takes around 45 seconds to cross it. The Howrah Maidan-Esplanade section is also touted as the first transportation tunnel under any mighty river in India and has the deepest metro station at Howrah.



JAIGARH FORT

JHALANA LEOPARD SAFARI



LOKTAK LAKE MANIPUR

Keibul Lanjao National Park is the only floating national park of the world. Loktak Lake is a miracle of nature as flora and fauna flourish over water. If you ever venture into North East India, then missing Loktak Lake is a crime. This ancient lake plays an important role in the economy of Manipur. It serves as a source of water for hydropower generation, irrigation and drinking. The lake is also a source of livelihood for the rural fishermen who live in the surrounding areas and on phumdis, also known as "phumshangs". Human activities have led to severe pressure on the lake ecosystem. 55 rural and urban hamlets around the lake have a population of about 100,000 people. Considering the ecological status and its bio-diversity values, the lake was initially designated as a wetland of international importance under the Ramsar Convention on 23 March 1990. It was also listed under the Montreux Record on 16 June 1993. It is a record of Ramsar sites where changes in ecological character have occurred.

DAMRO ARUNACHAL PRADESH

Damro is the base to the longest hanging bridge (1,000 feet) in Arunachal Pradesh. Definitely a hidden route to heaven, Damro charms with thatched bamboo houses, swaying suspended bridges, and the laid-back lifestyle of the locals. Among the list of unexplored places in India, it is a rural sort of getaway for exhausted city dwellers. The sights of harvested crops, not-so-wild bison, vast expanse of meadows and grasslands are quite welcoming.

The longest hanging bridge in Arunachal Pradesh made of ropes and bamboos, sways gently over the River Yamne. Using canes and wires, it is held between suspension cables with a walkway made of halved bamboos for paneling used as protection. The use of these materials is also the mark of the local tribal culture. This 1000 ft. long suspension bridge is used by the tribals to reach the other end of the bridge for their daily activities and livelihood. However, for visitors, it is an experience to cross this and look down the river to see a stunning display of colourful fishes hopping up and down in the river. A lot of people also visit this bridge for fishing and angling activities.
